Golden Gavel Goes to Bay Area Leadership Expert Jim Kouzes

Robert Schuller, Dr. Joyce Brothers, Zig Ziglar, Anthony Robbins, Stephen Covey, Debbi Fields, Deepak Chopra, Tom Peters, Ken Blanchard and Marcus Buckingham.

Mr. Kouzes will accept the award at a luncheon in his honor on Thursday, August 24 during Toastmasters International Convention in Washington D.C. He is a popular seminar and conference speaker who Wall Street Journal called "one of 12 most requested non-university executive education providers to U.S. companies."

Toastmasters International has helped more than four million people become better speakers since the organization's founding in 1924 at the YMCA in Santa Ana, Calif. Today, Toastmasters International has more than 200,000 members in 10,000 clubs in 90 countries, including several hundred clubs in the Bay Area alone.
