Cathcart devoted at least one hour every day to acquiring the skills needed to reach his goal. After two years, he joined the staff of a small company as a professional trainer. Then in June 1977, five years after setting his goal, he started his own business in La Jolla, California, as a full-time professional speaker and trainer.

After more than 20 years working in the field of human development and training people to improve their lives, Jim Cathcart now ranks among the best -- his 12 books and audio and videotapes have been translated into many languages. He is a former president of the National Speakers Association and has been inducted into the Speakers Hall of Fame. But this motivational speaker and trainer still dreams up five-year goals, writes them on a wallet-sized card and every day renews his commitment to reaching them.
